7. Information Items / Updates

- a. Amphitheatre project: January is when we will get the steel to wrap this project up by spring.
- b. Former CSX property: We closed on the property, and the quit claim deed actually arrived today. We are going to try to clean up the property lines with the other building that is partially onour property. We are planning to have green space, blacktop, a fence, landscaping, and a solution to assist with water drainage issues. The DPW placed steel at each corner staked.
- c. Parkview Cemetery: The fence is finally up! It looks nice and should help direct foot traffic to the sidewalks. The signs will be addressed in the spring.
- d. RCAP low to mod survey: We were pre-approved from the MEDC to have the Rural Community Assistance Program conduct a low to mod survey in the City of Grant. The Census tracts divide the City nearly down the middle. This survey is very similar to the one used in the Census. We would have to pay a third party to verify the official results, but projects like the CIPP might then be eligible for assistance.
